A Note from the People in Peril Team

In 2025, People in Peril continued to strengthen its monitoring and evaluation approach through the refinement of the comprehensive monitoring and evaluation framework and the introduction of an organisation-wide data visualisation tool. These systems enable programme data to be collected, and analysed in a consistent manner across countries and sectors.

As a part of this approach, the monitoring, evaluation, accountability, and learning department has also worked with the adjusted standardized Global Outcome, Achievement, and Learning (GOAL) Indicator framework to capture impact across programming and understand the full reach of PIP's work.

To this end, this report compiles all impact, outcome and output indicators in line with the M&E Framework and presents them both thematically and geographically.

The findings presented here are complemented through the interactive [Global Impact Dashboard in Power BI](#), which allows users to explore results across programmes, sectors, countries, and years, offering a dynamic and transparent view of People in Peril's global impact.

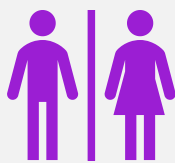

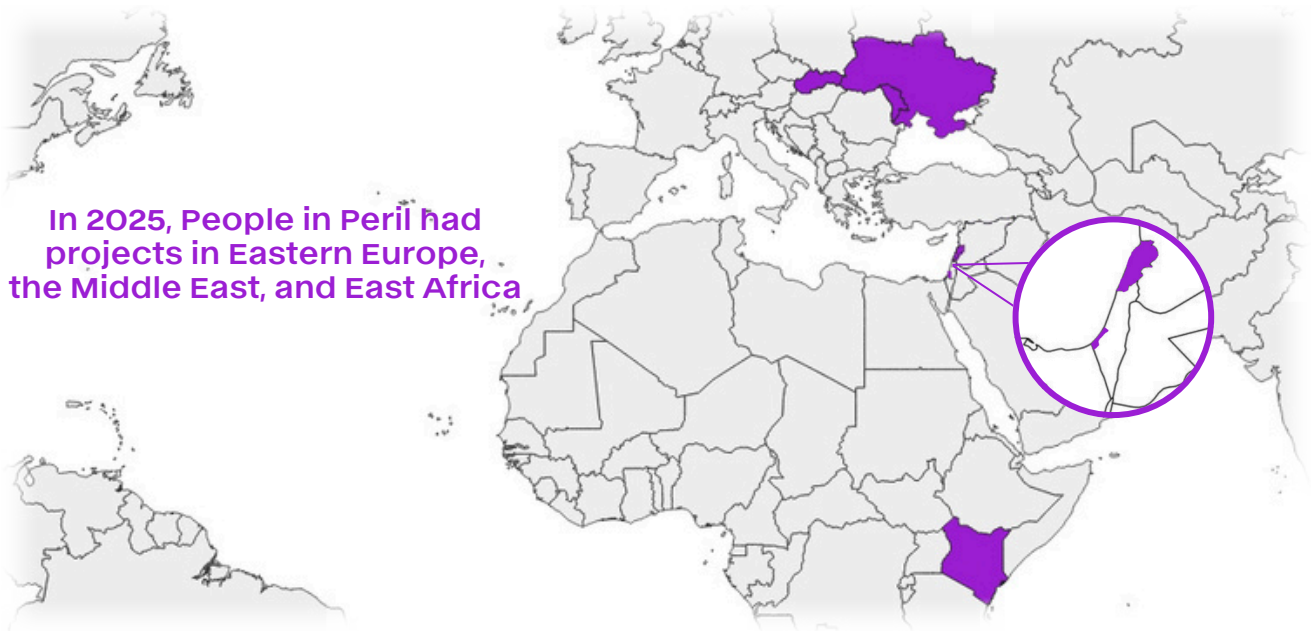

Intervention Impact

Emergency Response

89% of participants interviewed after receiving emergency support reported that they could better cope with their current situation

Humanitarian Aid

98% of participants interviewed after receiving humanitarian support reported that their basic needs had been met

Development Work

76% of participants interviewed after receiving community development assistance self-reported that their community had improved resilience against crises

Social Inclusion

98% of participants interviewed self-reported feeling safe in PIP's premises and found them accessible

61% of participants interviewed after participating in social inclusion activities reported that they had agency to access services in their community

Global Education

88% of participants reported increased global awareness / civic engagement after participating in global education activities



Cross-cutting Emphasis Achievements

In 2025, People in Peril continued to operate along four cross-cutting emphases: **safeguarding, gender mainstreaming, environmental mainstreaming, and advocacy**. People in Peril aimed to incorporate these four cross-cutting themes in all programming.

Safeguarding

91% of people reported that the assistance had been delivered in a **safe, accessible, accountable, and participatory** manner

Accountability

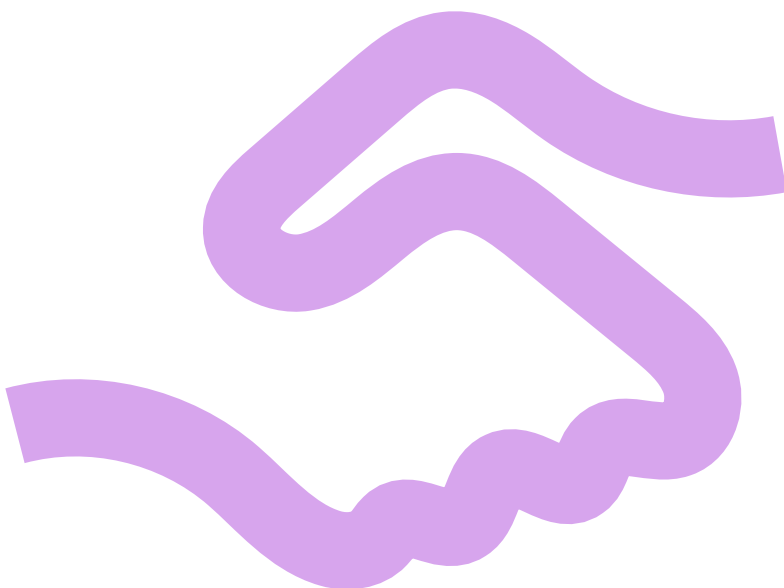
80% of stakeholders reported that they were aware of at least **one official channel** to raise a complaint to PIP

Partnership

235 partners were involved in the roll-out of PIP's activities

Advocacy

PIP was a part of **38 fora, multi-lateral organisations, networks, and working groups, etc**

Protection and MHPSS Impact

11 761 people
supported with protection and MHPSS services

91% of people interviewed reported improved mental, emotional, and social well-being, after accessing services

1 611 people supported with protection, mental health and psychosocial support services

9 691 children and caregivers supported with child protection services

782 protection or MHPSS group activities hosted, including community activities and low-threshold (easily accessible) activities

4 913 individual counselling sessions conducted

Education Impact

152 060 people supported through education activities



99% of students interviewed reported feeling safe, included, and supported in learning environments

94% of students interviewed reported more preparedness to the real world as a result of PIP's intervention

88% of caregivers interviewed reported that their school-aged child/ren had improved academic performance since participation in PIP educational activities

69% of caregivers interviewed who received humanitarian education support reported that their school-aged child/ren was more prepared to attend school

5 858 people attended festivals, media events, and/or other **art-based events**

119 432 students supported with **improved educational facilities, items, or instructions**

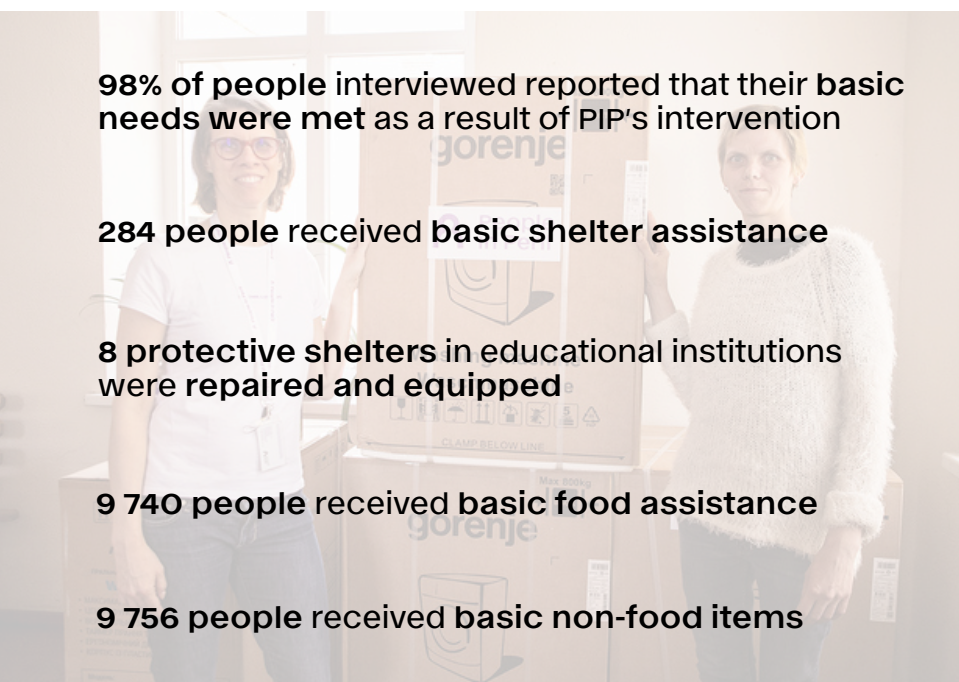

Impact by Area



Ukraine

PIP has been working in Ukraine since 2014 and has a fully established branch. In Ukraine, PIP focuses on protection and MHPSS, livelihoods, education, and basic assistance/shelter primarily in the 3 oblasts of Chernihiv, Sumy, and Poltava. PIP provides assistance directly and through partners.

PIP reached **7 417 people** in Ukraine in 2025

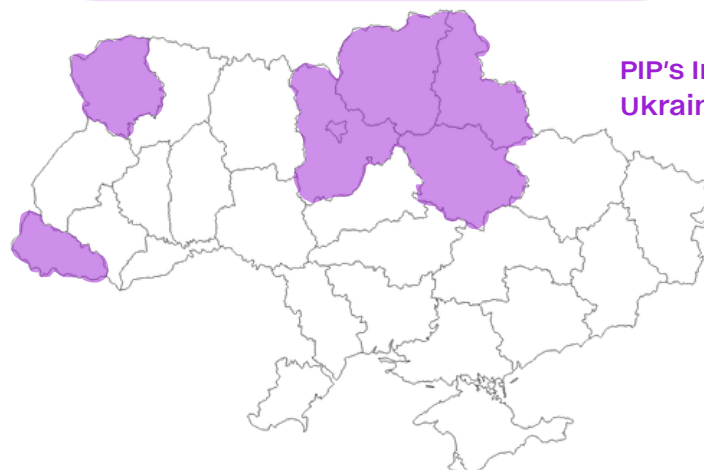

Protection

2 682 people
supported through Protection activities

89% of people reporting that the support was delivered in a safe, accessible, accountable, and participatory manner

94% of people who report increased ability to cope with their current challenges/situation as a result of PIP's support

784 children and caregivers supported with **child protection services**

22 protection group activities hosted, including community and low-threshold activities (easily accessible activities)

1 611 individuals participated in **awareness and capacity building events** touching on protection risks and mitigation responses

496 MHPSS consultations, 324 legal consultations and 15 gender-based violence (GBV) consultations/trainings and distribution occurred

78 non-GBV service providers were trained on **protection, mental health and psychosocial support**

209 dignity kits distributed to **evacuated women and girls**

We could hardly take anything with us when we fled through the 'green corridor'. Before the war, we didn't even think about things like a toothbrush, toothpaste, or shampoo – we just bought them as needed. This time, it wasn't possible; there was nowhere to put anything in the minibus during evacuation. After all, you can't take 10 towels when you're not even sure you can take 10 T-shirts for the children. That's why these dignity kits are such a big help for us right now.

Education

3 652 people
supported through Education activities

82% of students who report improved academic performance participating in PIP-supported education activities

100% of educators interviewed reported that education was safer and more inclusive

533 boys and girls, including children with disabilities, gained access to inclusive education opportunities/catch-up classes

262 children, including those with disabilities, were provided with individual learning kits

84 teachers received supervision support from a mentor







46 educators and non-educational personnel supported with improved educational materials and training

8 educational institutions were repaired with light repairs, with **2 727** beneficiaries benefitting from the rehabilitation of protective shelters



Livelihoods






531 people supported through livelihood activities

-  100% of individuals interviewed reported improved economic stability and self-sufficiency as a result of the intervention
-  32 TVET staff were trained to provide career counseling to their students
-  237 TVET participants developed essential skills
-  65 private entrepreneurs/businesses were provided with training and mentorship support
-  10 vulnerable families supported through micro-grants for economic resilience
-  187 participants received career counselling support



Basic Assistance and Shelter

552 people were supported with shelter and basic assistance

-  98% of people interviewed reported that their basic needs were met
-  284 individuals received basic shelter assistance
-  126 individuals received winterization assistance
-  142 individuals received basic non-food items
-  8 protective shelters in educational institutions repaired and equipped

Lebanon

550 people

PIP's first humanitarian intervention in Lebanon started in 2006 and intensified after the outbreak of the Syrian refugee crisis. In 2025, PIP primarily strengthened livelihoods through climate-resilient agricultural approaches in partnership with two local organisations.

Kenya

PIP in Kenya reached **1 290 people** in 2025

People in Peril's work in Kenya focuses on bolstering community groups and schools by providing practical livelihood support and training to agricultural workers and providing educational materials to schools. People in Peril works exclusively through local partners.

1 200 people were supported through textbooks and stationery

90 people received agricultural and livelihood support

Social Inclusion Programmes

23 251 people reached overall

The main vision of social inclusion programming in Slovakia is for people to have access to comprehensive services and to be able to fully participate in their communities. PIP programmes focus on five areas: social work, education, employment, community work, and volunteering, to create a safe environments for community members.

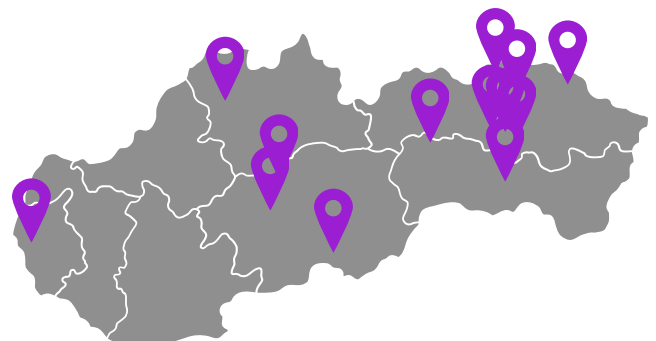

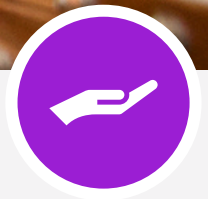

- ✓ 82% of participants interviewed reported increased confidence in participating in job interviews
-  82% of participants interviewed reported that they felt confident in independently submitting their CV
-  100% of interviewed external stakeholders (including municipalities, businesses) were engaged to improve inclusive livelihood opportunities to Roma population

Emergency Response

People in Peril provides rapid and effective humanitarian assistance to communities affected by crises, working both through local implementing partners and direct implementation. In 2025, PIP delivered critical aid and support in response to emergencies in Slovakia and Gaza, ensuring timely interventions tailored to the specific needs of each context.

 Slovakia

In 2025, a major fire in a Roma community settlement in Spišský Štiavnik left more than 140 people without shelter. People in Peril responded by providing emergency camp management support and referral assistance in coordination with local authorities.

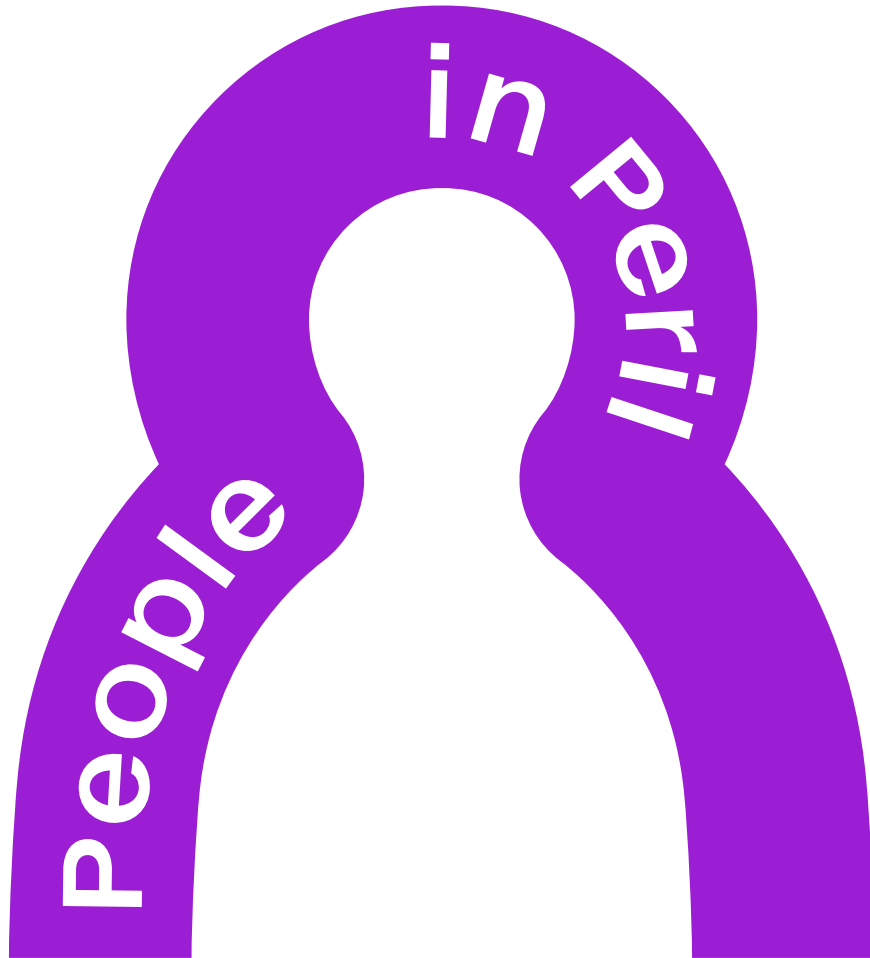
